Library

The growing collection which binds the user with the library comprises of various kinds of books, textbooks reference works, dictionaries, encyclopedias journals, magazines in print as well as electronic e-journals and various information resources. Presently the library houses 62,000 books covering all the disciplines of interest. This year books and journals worth 5 lakhs were purchased. Thirty Six students successfully completed the certificate course in Library and Information Science. National Archives of India, Ministry of Culture has sanctioned 93,675 for the Preservation and Conservation of manuscripts, books and documents. The library donated 110 books to the Central District Library as contribution to the enhancement of Tamil Libraries of the World. Quiz competition and the Best User prizes encourage the students to utilize the library resources.

Extension Activities

The students are constantly encouraged to be compassionate members of the community. Activities that foster life- long commitment to social service form part of the Extension activities. The students with the guidance of the faculty contribute to various social upliftment activities like NECTAR, NSS, NCC, Sthree Needhi, Social Service, League, AICUF and SNEHA.

NECTAR

The quote "We rise by lifting others" – is reinforced by the volunteers of NECTAR who serve the less privileged. Volunteers are sensitized to the need of impoverished people in their neighbourhood. As a regular activity, the students visit Mother Teresa Home for the Destitute every weekend and help the inmates in cleaning, washing, serving and interacting with them. Besides, regular coaching classes are conducted for the poor students of Dr. Ambedkar girls hostel. Independence day was celebrated at KOSHI – Kasthuribah Deaf and Dumb School.

NSS

This enthusiastic wing of our college fosters a sense of compassionate service in the students. They involve themselves in benevolent activities like Tree planting, Dental and Eye Checkups. 124 student volunteers along with 3 programme officers participated in the annual special camp at Sultanpet village.
