6. Personal counseling is given to the students who are in need of guidance.



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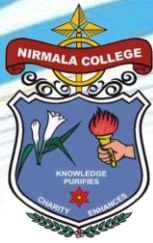

8. The differently abled students are given special care in the institution. Other students are encouraged to take care of these students and assist them at all times. Ramp and wheel chair is available for their easy movement.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Attendance is compulsory for regular classes and the students are strictly asked to maintain punctuality.
2. Attendance during tests and internal assessments is compulsory.
3. A student requiring leave must apply in advance in the prescribed form. Medical certificate must be submitted on medical grounds.
4. Students are expected to be dressed modestly maintained by the institution. Their personality should be neat, clean, simple and presentable.
5. Students should wear white dress on special occasions especially on Independence Day.
6. Books, magazines and other materials that are not approved by the Principal shall not be circulated in the College Campus. During free hours, students can make use of the college Library.

8. Students should avoid expressing anything by word or deed that may disturb the unity and harmony in the premises.
9. Students must show due respect to their teachers and other staff of the college.
10. Ragging at any level is considered a serious offence.
11. Students must wear their ID cards inside the college campus.
12. Students must maintain the decorum in the classes, functions of the college, association meetings and other gatherings.
13. Students are forbidden from organizing any meeting on their own in the college or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
14. Any Student who violates any of the rules of the college either in word or deed shall be deemed to have committed a breach of discipline.
