POLICY

- 1. To prioritize environment sustainability in compliance with the applicable regulations, policies and standards.

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OUTCOMES

- 2. Policy communicated to the administrators, students, teaching and nonteaching staff
- 3. Best clean and Green Campus Award received from an ISO certified institution Nature Science Foundation for making the campus greenish and Eco-friendly environment to the stakeholders
- 4. Energy efficiency measures viz switching off lights, minimising waste, plastic free campus, using carry bags, promotion of bicycles, planting trees and organic farming
- 5. Using LED Lighting in classrooms and laboratories, Use of renewable energy Solar Water Heaters in the hostel roof to cater to the needs of the residents and the hostel kitchen. Installation of Solar Photovoltaic (SPV) Street Lights:, Rooftop Solar Power Plant: and also planned to provide surplus to the grid and Installation of Automatic Water Tank controller in the Hostel
- 6. Converting leaf litter and vegetable wastes from the college and hostel into organic vermicompost and converting leaf litter from the medicinal garden into organic compost with the aid of EM4.
- 7. Preparing and distributing paper bags to nearby shops and also trains students in Wire Basket Making.
- 8. Environment Society and NSS volunteers for reduction of plastic waste by requesting people to carry their own water bottles and avoid the use of plastic cups, spoons and straws.
- 9. Obsolete computers and accessories are disposed of by auctioning to government approved e-waste recyclers.
- 10. A continuous awareness programmes and campaign by different Clubs was carried out by motivating to participate in activities both inside and outside
- 11. Used papers and cardboards are sent to authorised dealers for recycling. Unused sheets of end semester answer booklets are redesigned as notebooks and distributed to the needy.
- 12. Eco-friendly pesticides are used for book preservation in the library.
- 13. Restricted entry of vehicles in campus and pooling of vehicles by teachers, Celebrate NO VECHICLE DAY, battery powered vehicles and use of bicycle.
- 14. A total of 9 villages have been adopted by the College under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Support, awareness and necessities are given to the villagers.
- 15. Encouraged the weavers of ethnic sarees by providing platforms to put up stalls and enabled a sale to aid their livelihood.
